

## SINGULAR EVENT DETERMINATION

Singular Event is a one-time event in which one resident was harmed in an isolated incident (one incident) that is not the result of a pattern or widespread issues.

## What are some of the systemic factors the surveyors should look for?

- Before the incident, did the facility provide adequate training for staff?
- Were there ongoing trainings to ensure competency of staff are maintained?
- Upon interview, was the staff was made aware of the specific care needs required by the resident?
- Was the protocol to transfer care plans among staffs well-known?
- Was the environment safe for the staff to perform their duties?

- Did the facility have an up-to date policies and were the contents of the policies shared with staff?
- Were the equipments and other tools used by staff available, well-maintained and were the manuals readily available for staff's use?
- Did the facility have previous knowledge of the factors that may lead to the incident?
- Has a similar incident occurred previously?
- Was prior intervention implemented to prevent future incidents?

The above questions are not all-inclusive. These are just examples of questions to ask when making a Singular Event determination.
