## SUBJECT: Proposed Collection for Updated 2020 Program Audit Protocols - 30-Day Comment Period

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is announcing an opportunity for sponsoring organizations and other stakeholders to comment on the proposed Medicare Parts C and D Program Audit and Timeliness Monitoring Data Requests and other supporting data collection instruments. The updates to this package are based on comments received during the 60-day comment period that closed October 15, 2019.

CMS intends to begin using the approved protocols and sending routine program audit engagement letters to sponsoring organizations starting in March through July 2020.
