41515.2 Infectious Diseases
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CCS applicants diagnosed with at least one of the following shall be medically eligible for participation in the CCS program:

(a)

Infections of the bone, such as osteomyelitis and periostitis.

(b)

Infections of the eye when the infection, if untreated, may result in permanent visual impairment or blindness.

(c)

Infections of the central nervous system which have produced a neurologic impairment that results in physical disability requiring surgery or rehabilitation services to regain or improve function, such as movement or speech, which was limited or lost as a result of the infection.

(d)

Infections acquired in utero and for which medically necessary postnatal treatment is required, such as toxoplasmosis, cytomegalovirus infection, rubella, herpes simplex, and syphilis.

(e)

Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV infection), when confirmed by laboratory tests.
