67384.2 Applicability

(a)

Effective July 1, 2006, the best management practice requirements of this chapter shall apply to all persons managing perchlorate materials as described in section 67384.3, except those listed in subsection (b) of this section.

(b)

The requirements of this chapter do not apply to the following perchlorate materials: (1) Perchlorate materials managed as a hazardous waste in compliance with all applicable requirements of California hazardous waste law; (2) Perchlorate-contaminated media under the oversight of a regulatory agency with jurisdiction pursuant to applicable environmental statutes that address response, removal or remediation of the perchlorate contamination, except when disposed at a landfill; (3) Perchlorate materials containing less than six (6) parts per billion (ppb) of perchlorate; (4) Consumer goods manufactured in California prior to, but no later than December 31, 2006, and consumer goods transported into California prior to, but no later than to December 31, 2006; (5) Food, crops, and irrigation water; and (6) Combustion residuals of perchlorate materials.

Perchlorate materials managed as a hazardous waste in compliance with all applicable requirements of California hazardous waste law;

(2)

Perchlorate-contaminated media under the oversight of a regulatory agency with jurisdiction pursuant to applicable environmental statutes that address response, removal or remediation of the perchlorate contamination, except when disposed at a landfill;

(3)

Perchlorate materials containing less than six (6) parts per billion (ppb) of perchlorate;

(4)

Consumer goods manufactured in California prior to, but no later than December 31, 2006, and consumer goods transported into California prior to, but no later than to December 31, 2006;

(5)

Food, crops, and irrigation water; and

(6)

Combustion residuals of perchlorate materials.
