76527 Clients' Rights-Cause for Denial of Clients' Rights (a)

Good cause for denying a client the exercise of a right exists when the professional person in charge of a facility has good reason to believe: (1) That the exercise of the specific right would be injurious to the client; or (2) There is evidence that the specific right, if exercised would seriously infringe on the rights of others; or (3) The facility would suffer serious damage if the specific right is not denied; and (4) That there is no less restrictive way of protecting the interests specified in (1), (2) or (3).

That the exercise of the specific right would be injurious to the client; or

(b)

The reason used to justify the denial of a right to a client shall be related to the

specific right denied.

(c)

A right shall not be withheld or denied as a punitive measure, nor be considered a privilege to be earned nor as part of a client's individual program.

(d)

Waivers signed by the client or by the responsible relative, guardian or conservator shall not be used as a basis for denying rights in a client's individual program. Any waivers of a client's rights shall be reviewed and approved by the clients' rights advocate.
