The licensee shall ensure that at the time of admission, an Initial Assessment Plan which identifies the immediate needs of the child is developed and includes the following: (1) Name. (2) Age. (3) Physical limitations. (4) History of infections or contagious diseases, if known. (5) History of other medical, emotional, behavioral or physical problems, if known. (6) Plan for providing services to meet the individual needs identified above. (7) Planned length of stay.

(b)

Within seven days of admission, the initial assessment plan shall also address and work towards alleviating the family crisis or stressful situation by including the following:(1) Identify the family crisis or stressful situation (2) Identify the services to be provided by the crisis nursery in cooperation with community resources. These services may include referrals to appropriate family treatment, counseling, and prevention services. (3) Visitation, including the frequency of and any limitations on visits inside and outside the crisis nursery.
