87415 Night Supervision

(a)

The following persons providing night supervision from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. shall be familiar with the facility's planned emergency procedures, shall be trained in first aid as required in Section 87465, Incidental Medical and Dental Care Services, and shall be available as indicated below to assist in caring for residents in the event of an emergency: (1) In facilities caring for less than sixteen (16) residents, there shall be a qualified person on call on the premises. (2) In facilities caring for sixteen (16) to one hundred (100) residents at least one employee shall be on duty on the premises, and awake. Another employee shall be on call, and capable of responding within ten minutes. (3) In facilities caring for one hundred one (101) to two hundred (200) residents, one employee shall be on call, on the premises; one employee shall be on duty on the premises and awake; and one employee shall be on call and capable of responding within 10 minutes. (4) Every additional 100 residents, or fraction thereof, shall require an additional one (1) staff person on duty, on the premises and awake. (5) In facilities required have a signal system, specified in Section 87303, Maintenance and Operation, least one night staff person shall be located to enable immediate response to the signal system. If the signal system is visual only, that person shall be awake. (6) The requirements of this section shall not prohibit compliance with additional supervisory requirements required by the State Fire Marshal.

(1)

In facilities caring for less than sixteen (16) residents, there shall be a qualified person on call on the premises.

(2)

In facilities caring for sixteen (16) to one hundred (100) residents at least one employee shall be on duty on the premises, and awake. Another employee shall be on call, and capable of responding within ten minutes.

(3)

In facilities caring for one hundred one (101) to two hundred (200) residents, one employee shall be on call, on the premises; one employee shall be on duty on the premises and awake; and one employee shall be on call and capable of responding within 10 minutes.

(4)

Every additional 100 residents, or fraction thereof, shall require an additional one (1) staff person on duty, on the premises and awake.

(5)

In facilities required to have a signal system, specified in Section 87303, Maintenance and Operation, at least one night staff person shall be located to enable immediate response to the signal system. If the signal system is visual only, that person shall be awake.

(6)

The requirements of this section shall not prohibit compliance with additional supervisory requirements required by the State Fire Marshal.
