87821 Water Supply Clearance

(a)

All facilities where water for human consumption is from a private source shall meet the following requirements: (1) As a condition of initial licensure, the applicant shall provide evidence of an on-site inspection of the source of the water and a bacteriological analysis which establishes the safety of the water, conducted by the local health department, the State Department of Health Services or a licensed commercial laboratory. (2) Subsequent to initial licensure, the licensee shall provide evidence of a bacteriological analysis of the private water supply as frequently as necessary to ensure the safety of the residents, but no less frequently than specified in the following table: LICENSED

CAPACITY	ANALYSIS REQUIRED	PERIODIC SUBSEQUENT ANALYSIS
6 or fewer	Initial Licensing	Not required unless evidence supports the need for such analysis to protect residents.
7 through 15	Initial Licensing	Annually
16 through 25	Initial Licensing	Semiannually

As a condition of initial licensure, the applicant shall provide evidence of an on-site inspection of the source of the water and a bacteriological analysis which establishes the safety of the water, conducted by the local health department, the State Department of Health Services or a licensed commercial laboratory.
