100098 Medical Flight Crew

The medical flight crew of an EMS aircraft shall have training in aeromedical transportation as specified and approved by the authorizing EMS agency including but not limited to: (1) General patient care in-flight. (2) Changes in barometric pressure, and pressure related maladies. (3) Changes in partial pressure of oxygen. (4) Other environmental factors affecting patient care. (5) Aircraft operational systems. (6) Aircraft emergencies and safety. (7) Care of patients who require special consideration in the airborne environment. (8) EMS system and communications procedures. (9) The prehospital care system(s) within which they operate including local medical and procedural protocols. (10) Use of onboard medical equipment.
